- Two square miles
- In Montgomery County, bordering DC and Prince George's County
- 17,000 residents
 - 43% White; 34% Black; 14% Hispanic or Latino; 4% Asian; 5% other
- 7,000 housing units
- Older homes, large historic district
- Regional investor owned utilities



Best Practices & Trends

- Make climate & equity central in all Plans
- City Council adopt measurable goals
- All departments should be working on sustainability goals
- Cities, states, and counties moving towards mandatory energy efficiency standards, electrification
- Mapping and data to inform plans and resource distribution
- Competition motivates
- Rebates get stale, limited time enhancements and deadlines can invigorate
- Harness the co-benefits of health, indoor air quality, comfort, cost savings
- Process & advice coach impactful

Takoma Park's Efforts



- Greenhouse Gas Mitigation
 - Buildings HVAC & lighting upgrades
 - LED Streetlight conversion
 - Energy coaching, education, solar co-ops
 - Incentive & assistance programs
 - Curbside food waste collection, waste diversion
- Polystyrene, Straw, and Bag bans

- Zero waste plastic-free shop
- Reusable take-out container system
- Country's first gas station to convert to an all EV charging station
- Community fridges with free meals
- Plus many activist groups
