


Sentinel Landscapes Program


- Founded in 2013 by U.S. Depts of Defense, Agriculture, and Interior



Climate Resiliency – 'Mapping' Efforts




Southern Maryland – Shoreline Restoration Collaborative Project

Eastern Shore – Marsh Migration Corridors Collaborative Project

- Conserving 4,000 acres
- oTNC awarded FY20 \$3M REPI Challenge award
- Matched by USFWSNAWCA award

Eastern Shore – Marsh Migration Corridors Collaborative Efforts

- Expanding use of coastal resilience easements & management plans
 - Building off MD DNR's strong foundation
 - TNC convening partners to develop shared resilience easement language
- o Pilot Project:
 - Conserving key tract in marsh migration corridor & developing Marsh Migration Management Plan
 - Led by Eastern Shore Land Conservancy in partnership with The Nature Conservancy
 - REPI Challenge proposal submitted in 2022
