








Community Engagement

➤ Sacred Place Steering Committee Meeting #1:

- Establish baseline information about the site and the core elements that can and can't be a part of the final design.
- Craft a vision statement for the site.

≻Charrette #1:

 A creative approach to gathering feedback on the overall direction and desired features of the Sacred Place.

➤ Charrette #2:

• Building on the feedback and energy from Charrette #1 this event will deepen the engagement with community members around design of the Sacred Place.

≻Sacred Place Steering Committee Meeting 2:

 Meet with the Firesoul and Nature Sacred Design Team to finalize the schematic design.

Case study: Roberta's House



A Black-led bereavement center in Baltimore,

Roberta's House was looking for a design for the rooftop space of their new building that would include space for both active programming and small group or solitary reflection. They also have a ground-level space that they wanted to use as an open lawn and event area.




